CARES ACT REPORTING ON EMERGENCY FINANCIAL AID GRANTS TO STUDENTS

On March 27, 2020, the Federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, providing funds to institutions from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to make Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food, course materials, technology, health care, and child care. The law requires institutions to report certain information related to the use of these funds. The following information is reported for the period, May 27, 2020 to September 30, 2020.

- I. This statement shall serve to acknowledge that our institution signed and returned to the US Department of Education the Certification and Agreement - Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. We further attest that our institution has used, and/or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- II. The total amount of funds that the institution received on May 27, 2020 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student is \$ 81,936.00.
- III. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of September 30, 2020, is \$81,936.00
- IV. The estimated total number of students at our institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 97.
- V. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to date is 97.
- VI. The following is the method used by our institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much each student has received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

The funds were distributed evenly among eligible students.

- VII. The follow instructions/directions/guidance was provided by our institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

Dear NRI Student:

The United States Congress and The United States Department of Education have awarded NRI Institute of Health Sciences \$81,936.00 to be distributed to qualified students for emergency aid due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

This payment is being made to you as a direct grant for the expenses you incurred as a direct result of the disruption of campus operations due to the coronavirus. These expenses include, but are not limited to, food, housing course materials, technology, health care and childcare.

How the funds are to be allocated is left entirely to the discretion of the school. Our management committee met and decided that the fairest way to distribute the funds is to take the full amount of the grant the school received and divide it by the number of eligible students and award every student the same amount.

NRI Institute of Health Sciences has received \$81,936.00 for the students. We have 97 eligible students. Divided among 97 students the award result is \$844.70 per student.

Enclosed is a check payable to you in the amount of \$844.70. It is our hope that these funds will offset some of the expenses you have incurred due to the Coronavirus 19 Pandemic.
